# PINEHURST SCHOOL Our place

## Term 1, 2022

Pinehurst School opens to all students on February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. We are currently at "Red" on the "Covid-19 Protection Framework" (the traffic lights system), and the rules we currently have in place for the start of term are appropriate for this level of the outbreak **at the moment**.

Please note: these rules may change between now and the start of term as the Covid-19 situation changes. This document will be updated and changed as and when needed.

By February 1<sup>st</sup>, every child in the school (with a few exceptions) will have had the chance to receive at least one shot of the Covid-19 vaccine. It is NOT mandatory for students to be vaccinated.

Our rules are appropriate for an environment where all adults are fully-vaccinated, and where most students are vaccinated.

There will be no formal "bubbles" in the school, though there will be restrictions on larger gatherings, especially when they are held indoors.

All students are expected to be learning in school. All staff will be in school. We will be running a full curriculum and most of our co-curricular programme.

We will be offering **some** online learning for students who fit one of the following categories:

- 1. Students who are unable to be vaccinated because of their age or because they are immuno-compromised;
- 2. Students who have to self-isolate, either because they have tested positive for Covid-19, or because they have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for Covid-19;
- 3. Students who are overseas and are unable to return to NZ.

The type of online learning will be different according to age and need.

## The general rule that always applies:

• If a child or adult has any cold or flu symptoms, or is unwell in any way, they are stay home until their symptoms have gone, and have a Covid-19 test if appropriate. **Nobody who is unwell in any way can be on the school site.** 

#### **Face Masks:**

- Only surgical masks, N95 masks, or other forms of high-quality medical-grade disposable masks are to be worn. Cloth masks are not an acceptable alternative.
- Masks will be required for students in Years 0 to 13 when they are inside school buildings or in crowded outdoor spaces (this includes the Science corridor and the front of school at the end of

- the school day). This includes classrooms and all other indoor spaces with the exception of the Gym and the Arena when students are doing physical activity.
- Masks will not be required for students in Years 0 to 13 when they are outside.
- Masks will be required for all teachers and for all adults working with students when they are inside school buildings. This applies to all inside spaces, without exception.
- In all staff meetings, all staff are required to wear a face mask. Staff may only meet in small groups, and they must wear a mask if they are unable to maintain a two-metre distance from other staff. In all other spaces, masks must be worn indoors unless staff are seated for the purpose of eating and drinking.
- In the Staff Room and other areas of high-traffic, masks must be worn at all times.
- Staff are not required to wear masks when they are outside, except where there is a high volume of people.
- All visitors to the school, including parents, must wear a mask at all times. Cloth masks are not acceptable.

#### **Tests**

- All staff are required to record a negative Covid-19 test (preferably PCR) between January 24<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.
- The school has purchased Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT), and these will be used for three purposes:
  - As part of a screening process, prior to any overnight trips or camps. All staff and supporting adults will be required to record a negative test result no more than 24 hours before departure.
  - If a child presents at school with any relevant symptoms, we may with a parent's permission – test the child.
  - o In the event of an exposure at school, we may test potential contacts with parents' permission as a rapid first response before PCR tests are undertaken.
- RATs may be used in other circumstances should they be required.

## Access to the school, signing-in and vaccine certificates:

- Parents and visitors are not permitted on the school site beyond the front or back car parks, except if they are picking up children in the Primary School at the end of the day or are escorted by a member of staff.
- Parents of College students picking up their children should stay in the car park area and wait for their child there.
- Parents of students starting school as New Entrants can escort their children to their classrooms for the first two weeks of term.
- All staff must sign in with the "WOL" app when they come onto the school site. This applies to all staff at all times and must be completed daily.
- All staff, parents and visitors must sign in on the Covid app when they come onto the school site. This includes parents who are picking up their child at the end of the day. This also includes any external adults who work with students. If parents stay in their cars, they do not need to sign in.
- All staff are fully-vaccinated, and follow Government mandates on vaccination according to the School's policy. Vaccinations must be maintained in line with Government requirements. Staff are required to ensure that the record of vaccination we hold is up to date.
- All visitors and parents who wish to meet with a member of staff in person or to enter the
  Uniform Shop must be fully-vaccinated. This will be checked on entry to Reception or in the
  Uniform Shop. This requirement does not apply if a parent is picking something up from
  Reception only or if they are picking up their child at the end of the day.

- The Uniform Shop will have a limit of two families inside the Shop at any time.
- If an unvaccinated parent wishes to meet with a member of staff, we will arrange an online meeting at a mutually convenient time.

#### In classrooms:

- All classrooms will have at least one window or door open on each side of the room at all times
  to ensure reasonable air circulation. This will also apply to offices and other spaces where
  possible.
- All rooms in which students are present will have a working air purifier.
- All students will sanitise hands on entry to their classroom and at regular intervals.
- All tables and chairs will be wiped down at the end of each lesson or session (not less frequently than once every two hours).
- There will be no physical distancing required inside classrooms, as this is not practical.
- A reminder that masks must be worn by all students and staff in all classrooms and at all times.
- Normal timetables will operate.

#### **Around School:**

- It isn't possible to operate a full school in "bubbles", but we will limit unnecessary contact with other parts of the school as much as we can.
- In Primary, we will keep Year 1 and 2 separate from other year groups, and we will maintain separation from College.
- In shared areas, such as the Library, we will develop protocols that allow us to keep groups of students apart from each other.
- The Library will be available at lunch times only to students in Years 11 to 13; and to students in Years 3 to 6. Numbers will be limited. The Library will be open before and after school as usual.
- Physical Education classes will be held outside except where there are very small numbers and it is essential for the curriculum for there to be a lesson indoors
- All food should be eaten outdoors

## **Drop-off and pick-up:**

- Before School Care will run as usual. It will be open from 7.30 am until 8.15 am daily for students in Years 1-6.
- Primary classrooms will be open and supervised from 8.15 am daily.
- College classrooms will be open from 8.00 am. College students are permitted in school from 7.30 am. They can wait outside, in classrooms, or in the Library, which opens at 7.30 am. Please note that College students are not supervised until 8.00 am.
- At the end of the day, Primary parents must enter the school grounds at 3.15 pm, pick up their child and leave immediately. Children will stay in their classes until they are picked up. Parents are not able to enter classrooms without a prior appointment. College parents are not permitted on the school grounds beyond the car park.
- After-school care will operate as usual, open between 3.15 and 5.30 pm and run by Youthtown.

• All adults must sign in on the Covid-19 app when entering the school grounds. This includes the car park if parents leave their cars. This also includes when they are picking up children after school hours or at any other time at all they are on the school site.

#### **Buses**

- Masks are mandatory for everyone of all ages on school buses (and all public transport).
- All students can use the school buses.
- Where possible, windows will be opened on buses. Some buses do not have windows that open.

## **Assemblies, Sports and other activities**

- All training, games and matches will take place as they usually do.
- All coaches, whether a member of the School's staff, or someone who has been employed externally, are fully-vaccinated. A register is kept of their vaccination status.
- All external facilities used by the school will only employ fully-vaccinated staff, and have a
  "vaccine certificate only" policy in place.
- Parents will not be permitted to watch in-school practices.
- College sports will go ahead. It has been agreed by all schools that students must be fully-vaccinated to take part in College sports, and we will apply that policy with our own students. All venues will be "vaccine certificate only" venues. Capacity limits of 100 if all students are vaccinated, and 25 if not, will be observed in school and at venues.
- For students under 12 years and 3 months, there is no "vaccine certificate". Students under this age are considered to be vaccinated for the purpose of capacity limits. Primary sports will therefore go ahead and will operate according to capacity limits.
- In all sporting activities, we will operate within the guidelines established by NZ Sport/
- No students from other schools are allowed on-site between 7.30 am and 4. 30 pm Monday to Friday. This includes for the purpose of taking part in sporting activities.
- Music, drama and other co-curricular activities will run as normal, and external providers will be
  able to operate on the school site. All adults, and young people aged 12 or more, will be fullyvaccinated, and all school rules on mask-wearing and room ventilation will apply.
- There will be no Assemblies and we will aim to have as few larger gatherings as possible.
- Camps are still running, subject to circumstances at the time they take place. All adults must be vaccinated and, as stated, we will test everyone within 24 hours of departure.
- Itinerant music lessons will continue, with music teachers remaining masked and fully-vaccinated at all times. Woodwind and brass lessons must be held individually.
- Musical groups must rehearse outdoors if there are any wind instruments involved.
- Singing activities must be held outdoors and singers must be at least 2 metres apart.
- No external students can take part in activities on-site during the school day.

# **Online learning - Primary**

There will be three online learning groups from the start of Term 1. A reminder that these lessons are only for students who are unable to be at school because they fit into one of the three categories at the start of this document.

New Entrants: Mrs Aston
Year 1 to 3: Mrs Watters
Year 4 to 6: Mrs Rodrigues

- The New Entrants and the Year 1-3 groups will have live online teaching until lunchtime every day. On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, this will mainly be Numeracy and Literacy. Some project-based work will be set to complete with a parent in the afternoons. On Fridays, the groups will be combined and there will be a focus on the Arts.
- Year 4-6 will have online teaching for five periods a day every day. This will be focussed on Numeracy and Literacy in the morning and there will be some project-based work in the afternoon.
- All sessions will be recorded on Teams to allow for time differences for overseas students.
- Students will be taught in groups according to their age and ability which will mean that there will be times when the teacher is working with older or younger students, and children may have work to do by themselves.
- Some subjects will not be covered in the programme. Spanish, Chinese, P.E. and Music will not be included because as these subjects are usually taught by specialists.
- Lessons will start at 9am with a morning welcome and timetable for the day in an online Team.
- The school day will follow the normal timetable, including morning tea and lunchtime.
- Your child's Homeroom teacher for 2022 will check in with them each week to see how they are.

## **Online learning - College**

A reminder that these lessons are only for students who are unable to be at school because they fit into one of the three categories at the start of this document.

- Students will be able to attend all or nearly all timetabled lessons through Teams.
- Teachers will open their lesson on the class Team at the start of each session, and will teach the class as usual.
- Teachers will wear a wireless headset to allow the students to clearly hear the teacher's voice.
   Lessons will therefore be available live, and they will also be recorded for those students who cannot be present live.
- Teachers will 'share' their screens so that students not in class will have the same visual information as students who are in the lesson.
- All class resources will be available to students on an appropriate platform (SchoolBox, OneNote etc.). Teachers will ensure that students are aware where resources are kept.
- All students will be expected to meet deadlines and all work will be marked and returned at the appropriate time.
- All parents will receive regular class communication from the teacher. Teachers will be available to students on email as usual
- There will be tutorials for online students when necessary.

## **Events and Gatherings**

- All events involving parents and other adults are "vaccine certificate only" events.
- The School will operate as a "hospitality" venue, following all Government mandates, when it runs an event for adults outside school hours.
- Wherever possible, events will be held outdoors. If this is not possible, ventilation rules and capacity restrictions will apply.
- While we are at "red", very few events will take place. We will follow hospitality requirements
  and we will also act cautiously in our usual manner, exceeding regulations in the interests of
  safety.

## **Contractors**

- All contractors on the school site, regardless of whether they have direct contact with students or staff, will be fully-vaccinated.
- College 5 / Pinehurst Theatre contractors will remain exclusively within the designated construction site.
